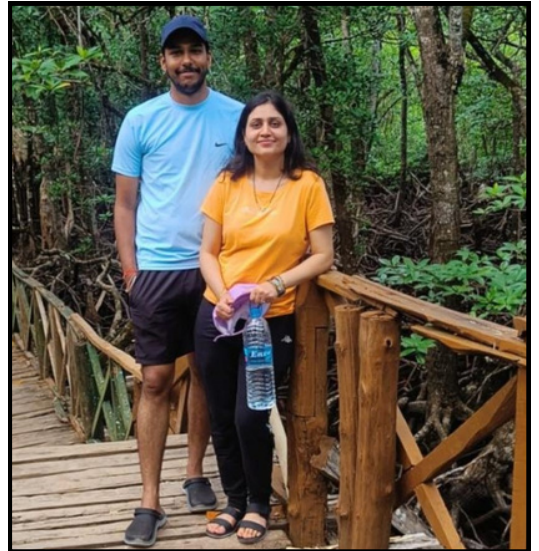
Rahul Kumar (PFM 2006-08) Appointed Business Head: A Triumph for IIFM Alumni



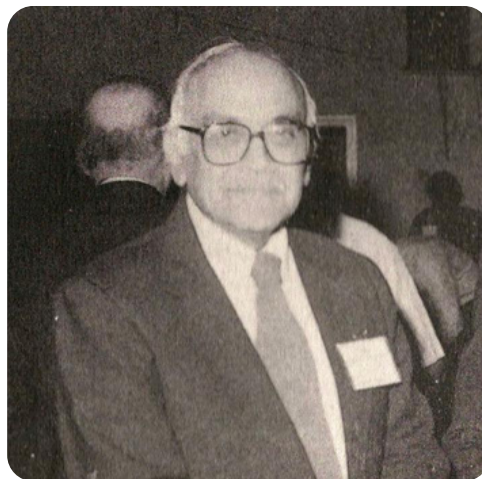

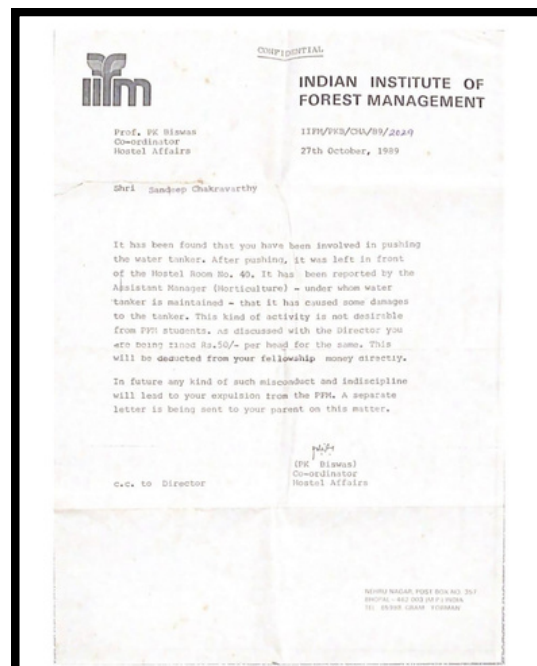

Let us exceed that this time!

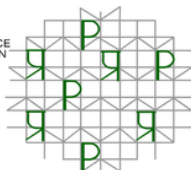

24th January 2024 marked the first session of “Friends of IIFM” series for the year 2024. The session was very apt to begin the year with the positivity, hope and inspiration by listening from a person who lived the dream to help many poor families to come out of poverty. Mr. Chandra Shekhar Ghosh (Founder, MD & CEO of Bandhan Bank) shared his journey which started as an NGO worker to realise the actual need of the poor people which is to secure three meals a day through income generating activities. The initial insights from a market at Kolkata and prevalent lending practices helped him to understand the huge potential for large number of small entrepreneurs to get fund through institutional lenders. He realised very early that “while small is beautiful, big is necessary”.

The session was introduced by our Alumni Association President Mr. Sandeep Chakravorty (PFM 1990) and it was moderated by our distinguished alumnus Mr. Vineet Rai

(PFM 1994). Our AA President had the opportunity to meet and interact with Mr. Chandra Shekhar Ghosh some time back and was very impressed with the story behind Bandhan Bank. Mr. Vineet Rai also knows Mr. Chandra Shekhar Ghosh very well and has seen the emergence of Bandhan Bank from its microfinance days. This along with the very interesting narration by Mr. Chandra Shekhar Ghosh, helped the participants to thoroughly enjoy the session. The number of participants was highest for the “Friends of IIFM” series, which was around 150.

It was not easy for Mr. Chandra Shekhar Ghosh to convert his dream into reality as it required to convince the banks that financing the poor for business is possible. He started the journey by demonstrating small business model with his own fund then with support from banks the scale started increasing till it required him to convert the NGO to NBFC to avail the scale of fund from the banks to be able to support larger number of people. In 2015, Bandhan Bank came into existence by opening 501 branches in a single day.

Ghosh Dada always believed in reducing the operational cost and that has helped the organization to survive from many difficult times, be it microfinance crisis of 2010 (which erupted in the Indian state of Andhra Pradesh in October 2010), or demonetisation in 2016 or the impact of pandemic COVID-19 during 2020-21. Today, Bandhan bank has turnover of more than 2 lakh crores, it has 3 crore 20 lakhs customers—out of which 2 crore customers are women, it has 75,000 employees, it has an asset of around 1 lakh 7 thousand crores. Although Bandhan Bank has grown big but around 75% of its portfolio is from core client base which is evident from the fact that 73% of its branches are situated in rural and semi-urban areas. No doubt, Bandhan Bank is a Bank with Difference. The story of a person, son of a sweet shop owner, starting the journey as an NGO worker to now leading a bank which is bringing positive changes in the lives of crores of people is very-very inspiring.

During the question-answer session, the participants of “Friends of IIFM Series” received enriching answers from Mr. Chandra Shekhar Ghosh. The response and enthusiasm from the participants only call for a follow up session some time soon.
